L1	Commission direction on how they want to proceed, and
L2	obviously there's a lot of interest in this case with
13	a lot of parties.

15	hearing would be helpful and whether the nature of
16	that hearing what that might be, whether we had
L7	prefiled testimony, whether we would just go on the
18	record and see what happens, however you think would
L9	be appropriate for the Commission to proceed.
20	I'm not going to ask you to tell me that
21	today. The reason I brought you-all together is so

I'm not going to ask you to tell me that today. The reason I brought you-all together is so you can discuss that and how you can give me a written recommendation. And what I'm going to ask you to do is file a procedural schedule about a week from today, which is September 19.

1	If you can't all agree on a proposed
2	schedule, give me competing schedules, and I'll
3	present it to the Commission, and they can decide how
4	they want to proceed.
5	I will say that in the previous case
6	involving Ameren's Resource Filing on Chapter 22, the
7	Commission determined it was not a contested case
8	proceeding so that a hearing is not absolutely
9	necessary, but it still may be helpful with the
10	Commission in making its decision, so I'll leave you
11	to your discussions, unless there's anything else
12	anyone wants to bring up while we're on the record.
13	MR. WILLIAMS: Does the Commission have
14	any guidance about whether it would like to see more
15	information?
16	JUDGE WOODRUFF: I do not have any
17	guidance from the Commission, so it's from my
18	perspective, as the person who will probably have to
19	write this, I think more information would probably
20	be helpful, but whether that needs to be done in a
21	formal-type hearing, I'll leave it to your
22	recommendations.
23	Did we have someone else join us on the
24	line?
25	MS. PEMBERTON: Yes, this is Terri
