DIRECTORY SERVICES

6.1 GENERAL

- 6.1.1 Telephone Directory Distribution - The Telephone Company distributes to its customers without charge a directory of customer listings which are generally necessary for the efficient use of the service. Any additional directories or information requested by a customer will be furnished where, in the opinion of the Company, such provisions will lend to a more efficient use of the service by that particular customer. Other directories will be furnished at the discretion of the Company at a reasonable rate.
- 6.1.2 Telephone Directory Ownership - Directories regularly furnished to customers are the property of the Telephone Company, are loaned to customers only as an aid to the use of the telephone service and are to be returned to the Telephone Company upon request. The Telephone Company shall have the right to make a charge for directories issued in replacement of directories destroyed, defaced or mutilated while in possession of customers.

6.2 DIRECTORY LISTINGS

- 6.2.1 The rates and regulations for directory listings in this section apply only to the alphabetical directory containing the regular alphabetical list of names of customers.
- 6.2.2 The alphabetical list of names of customers is for the purpose of informing calling parties of the telephone numbers of customers and those entitled to use customers' service, and special position or arrangement of names is not contemplated.
- 6.2.3 The Telephone Company limits the length of any listing in the directory by the use of abbreviations when, in the opinion of the Telephone Company, the clearness of the listing or the identification of the customer is not impaired thereby.
- 6.2.4 Listings must conform to the Telephone Company's practices with respect to its directories.

6.3.6 When the Telephone Company publishes an alphabetical directory of subscriber listings in two sections, one section containing a list of individual names and the other section consisting of a list of business names, primary and regular extra listings of business service subscribers consisting of the names of individuals will be published in both alphabetical sections without additional charge. Primary and regular extra listings of residential service subscribers will be published in both alphabetical sections without additional charge if the listings are indented under business listings consisting of the name of an individual. Primary and regular extra listings of residence service subscribers whose listings contain a healing profession designation will also be included in both alphabetical sections without additional charge.(1)

6.3.7 When the Telephone Company publishes a separate section in its directories of telephone numbers for government offices, the primary listing of the government office will be placed in this section. Regular extra listings may be purchased by the government office in the alphabetical section in which business listings regularly appear.

9.1.2 Such services are not in accord with the general plan of furnishing telephone service, and they will be furnished only under special conditions where the service is warranted by the circumstances involved. The Telephone Company does not obligate itself to furnish these services, particularly when it involves undue expense or impairment of the service furnished the general public.

9.1.3 These services are available only in connection with One-Party Line, Multiline or Private Branch Exchange Service.

9.1.4 Foreign Exchange Service will be provided in connection with Hotel/Motel services only for the exclusive use of the hotel management.

9.1.5 Exchange Service and extensions are furnished subject to the exchange charges, rules and regulations of the foreign serving office or foreign exchange from which they are furnished.

All other services and equipment including urban mileage are subject to the charges, rules and regulations of the exchange in which the termination is located.

- 10.1.4 It shall be the responsibility of the customer to provide suitable instructions for the proper operation of the Hotel and Motel Reservation Service by the public; to provide and contract for adequate service, equipment and facilities to meet the requirements of the public.
- 10.1.5 The liability of the Telephone Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service or other facilities shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistake, omission, interruption, delay or error or defect in transmission occurs. Such proportionate charge for each day for which an allowance is to be made shall be computed as one thirtieth (1/30) of the total charge for service for the month in which such interruption occurs. If, in the case of such interruption, service is restored on or before the day after said interruption is reported to or detected by the Telephone Company, no allowance will be made. No allowance shall be made and the Telephone Company shall not be liable in any amount for damages caused by the negligence of the customer or interruption caused by the misuse or abuse of the equipment by the transient public.

12.1.2 Shortest air line measurement from the customer's premises to the base rate area boundary is used in computing urban mileage charges. In those cases where the base rate area boundary follows the center line of a street or highway, all dwellings or structures facing or adjoining the street or highway and within 150 feet of the center line of the street or highway shall be considered within the base rate area. Urban mileage charges are payable in the same manner as charges for the associated service.

12.1.3 Where a party line customer has the exclusive use of one-half mile or more of a circuit outside the base rate area, and there are no prospects of obtaining additional customers to share the circuit within a reasonable length of time, the customer is charged the one-party line urban mileage rate for the portion of the circuit so used.

12.1.4 In certain outlying sections, having a community of interest, an average, or commuted urban mileage charge may be applied throughout the section, upon proper official approval. The average urban mileage charge is computed on the shortest air-line distance between the center of the section and the boundary of the base rate area. The sum of the average, or commuted urban mileage charge and the base rate is the locality rate for each class of service furnished.
