- 10.1.5 The liability of the Telephone Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service or other facilities shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistake, omission, interruption, delay or error or defect in transmission occurs. Such proportionate charge for each day for which an allowance is to be made shall be computed as one thirtieth (1/30) of the total charge for service for the month in which such interruption occurs. If, in the case of such interruption, service is restored on or before the day after said interruption is reported to or detected by the Telephone Company, no allowance will be made. No allowance shall be made and the Telephone Company shall not be liable in any amount for damages caused by the negligence of the customer or interruption caused by the misuse or abuse of the equipment by the transient public.

- 12.1.2 Shortest air line measurement from the customer's premises to the base rate area boundary is used in computing urlanglic Service Commission mileage charges. In those cases where the base rate area boundary follows the center line of a street or highway, all dwellings or structures facing or adjoining the street or highway and within 150 feet of the center line of the street or highway shall be considered within the base rate area. Urban mileage charges are payable in the same manner as charges for the associated service.
