ORDER DIRECTING EXPEDITED FILING OF AVAILABLE DATES FOR HEARING

On May 6, 2020, Evergy Metro Inc. d/b/a Evergy Missouri Metro and Evergy Missouri West, Inc. d/b/a Evergy Missouri West (collectively "Evergy") applied for an accounting authority order to govern costs and financial impacts associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. On July 1, 2020, the Commission set a hearing date of September 30-October 1, 2020. On September 28, 2020, at Evergy's request, the Commission suspended the procedural schedule and continued the hearing to accommodate the parties' settlement discussions.

On October 8, 2020, some of the parties filed a *Non-unanimous Stipulation and Agreement* proposing to resolve the case. The signatories to the agreement are Evergy, the Staff of the Commission, Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers, Midwest Energy Consumers Group, and Sierra Club. Three other parties, Missouri-American Water Company, Spire Missouri Inc., and Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri, are not signatories to the agreement. The agreement indicates those three parties do not object to the agreement and will not request a hearing. The agreement makes no representation as to the position of the remaining parties: Office of the Public Counsel

(OPC), National Housing Trust (NHT) and Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri.

On October 15, 2020, OPC filed an objection to the agreement and NHT filed an objection and requested a hearing.

The Commission will order the parties to submit, no later than 1 p.m. October 21, 2020, available dates for a two-day hearing in this matter. All submissions shall include available dates occurring after November 2, 2020. If convenient for some or all parties, such submissions may be made by joint filing. The parties may consult the Commission's hearings calendar, published at the Commission's website at https://psc.mo.gov to identify conflicts.¹

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. No later than 1 p.m. October 21, 2020, the parties shall file statements of available dates for a two-day hearing in this matter, as described above.
 - 2. This order shall be effective when issued.
