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

ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO ALLOW LATE FILING OF LANGSTON REBUTTAL TESTIMONY

On May 29, 2001, Missouri Gas Energy (MGE) filed a motion asking that the Commission grant it leave to late file the rebuttal testimony of Michael Langston regarding Off System Sales and Capacity Release Revenues. The procedural schedule established for this case directed that rebuttal testimony be filed no later than May 22, 2001. MGE's motion indicates that it did not file the rebuttal testimony of Michael Langston by May 22 because it anticipated, incorrectly, that the issue would be settled. MGE indicated that it would file Langston's testimony no later than June 1, 2001. Subsequently, Langston's testimony was filed on June 1.


4 CSR 240-2.080(16) provides that parties shall be allowed not more than ten (10) days from the date of filing in which to respond to any pleading unless otherwise ordered by the commission. More than ten days have passed since MGE filed its motion and no responses have been filed.

The Commission has considered MGE's motion and finds that it should be granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Missouri Gas Energy's Motion to Allow Late Filing of Langston Rebuttal Testimony is granted.
2. That this order shall become effective on June 21, 2001.


