**ORDER REQUESTING ADDITIONAL COMMENTS AND EXTENDING TIME
FOR STAFF TO FILE RECOMMENDATION**

The Commission opened this working case in 2010 to facilitate Staff's review of the Commission's rules regarding fuel adjustment clauses for electric utilities. On February 4, 2015, the Commission directed Staff to complete its review and file its recommendations regarding changes to the fuel adjustment clause rules by September 15, 2015. The Commission later extended that completion date to November 20, 2015, and then to February 15, 2016.

Staff has continued its review and has discussed possible rule changes with the stakeholders at a series of workshops. On February 5, 2016, one of those stakeholders, Ameren Missouri, filed a mark-up of Staff's latest draft of its rule revision. Later that day, Staff filed a motion asking that stakeholders be allowed until March 1, 2016 to file comments about Staff's draft rule and Ameren Missouri's mark-up of that rule. Staff also asks that the date for completion of Staff's review be extended until the week of April 11, 2016.

The Commission finds that the request for additional time is reasonable and will grant that request.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Any stakeholder wishing to file comments regarding Staff's draft proposed rule revision and Ameren Missouri's mark-up of Staff's proposed rule revision shall do so no later than March 1, 2016.
2. The Commission's Staff shall complete its review and provide the Commission with its recommendation regarding changes to the fuel adjustment clause rules at the Commission's agenda meeting during the week of April 11, 2016.
3. This order shall be effective when issued.
