## **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

COMES NOW the Staff ("Staff") of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") in the above-captioned matter and for its recommendation states as follows:

- 1. On February 14, 2001, Laclede Gas Company (Laclede) filed a Motion for Waiver to Make a Second Unscheduled Winter Purchased Gas Adjustment Filing. The Waiver has been requested because of the recent decline in the cost of natural gas. Staff recommends that the Motion for Waiver be granted.
- 2. Also on February 14, 2001, Laclede filed a tariff sheet, proposed to become effective March 1, 2001, that reflects reductions in the cost of natural gas. This filing should reduce customer charges for the cost of natural gas for the remaining month of the winter season.
- 3. Staff has reviewed the proposed tariff filing, and recommends that it be approved effective March 1, 2001. The recommendation of the Gas Department Tariffs/Rate Design Staff is attached hereto (please see Attachment A). Staff notes that good cause has been shown pursuant to §393.140 (11) RSMo (2000) to permit the tariff to become effective on less than thirty days notice. Staff also recommends that the rates be interim, subject to refund.

WHEREFORE, the Staff recommends that the Commission grant the Motion for Waiver to Make a Second Unscheduled Winter Purchased Gas Adjustment Filing requested by Laclede and approve the proposed tariff sheet to become effective March 1, 2001.

On February 14, 2001, Laclede Gas Company (Laclede or Company) of St. Louis, Missouri filed a tariff sheet proposed to become effective March 1, 2001. The tariff sheet was filed to reflect unscheduled changes in Laclede's Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) factors as the result of reductions in the current cost of natural gas for the remaining month of the winter season. The winter season includes the months of November through March. The current cost of gas is significantly less than the PGA Laclede filed in its first Unscheduled Winter filing effective January 29, 2001. This filing would eliminate 64% of the increase that went into effect on January 29, 2001.

On February 14, Laclede also filed a MOTION FOR WAIVER TO MAKE AN UNSCHEDULED WINTER PURCHASED GAS ADJUSTMENT FILING (Motion). This Motion for Waiver from the PGA Clause of Laclede's tariff is due to a decline in the market price of gas since its first unscheduled winter filing effective January 29, 2001. In addition, Laclede cites the following reasons for approval of this Motion for Waiver:

- 1. It will expedite the flow-through to ratepayers of the financial benefits of the Company's Price Stabilization Program.
- 2. It will compensate for the unexpected drop in wellhead natural gas prices that has occurred since the Company made its first Unscheduled Winter PGA filing on January 12, 2001.

Laclede also requests that the tariff sheet become effective in compliance with the filing procedures set forth in Laclede's PGA tariff. These filing procedures allow for filings to be effective in 10 or more business days instead of the usual 30 days notice requirement.

The net effect of these changes will decrease the firm PGA factor for the remaining month of the winter season to \$0.75311 per therm from the first unscheduled winter season firm PGA factor of \$0.91311 per therm. The firm PGA factor would decrease by 18% under this proposal. The effect of the proposed decrease on a typical residential customer's bill for March 2001 is a 14%

decrease when compared to the rates that are currently in effect. A typical residential customer's usage is fixed at 159 therms for March and does not account for the impact of weather variations on usage. Weather variations could lessen or exacerbate the impact of this increase.

Case No. GR-2001-387, under which this change was filed, was established to track the Company's PGA factors to be reviewed in its 2000-2001 ACA filing. Final Commission decisions in Laclede's ACA Case Nos. GR-2000-622, GR-99-316, GR-98-297, GR-97-222 for the 1999-2000, 1998-1999, 1997-1998, and 1996-1997 ACA periods respectively, are still pending. Interim subject to refund status should be maintained pending final Commission decisions in Case Nos. GR-97-222, GR-98-297, GR-99-316, GR-2000-622, and GR-2001-387.

The Commission's Gas Department - Tariffs/Rate Design Staff (Staff) has reviewed the Motion and agrees that the Motion for Waiver request be granted. Staff has also reviewed the PGA filing and has determined that, with the exception of the Motion for Waiver to file an unscheduled winter PGA, this filing was calculated in conformance with Laclede's PGA Clause. Staff is of the opinion that good cause for approval of this tariff sheet on less than thirty days notice is demonstrated by Laclede's Commission-approved PGA clause allowing for ten (10) business days notice for PGA change filings. Therefore, Staff recommends the Commission grant the Motion for Waiver by the Company on February 14, 2001, and approve the following tariff sheet to become effective March 1, 2001, interim subject to refund:

#### REMARKS

For a typical residential customer using approximately 159 Therm's during March, natural gas rates will decrease by \$25.44 or approximately 14% when comparing the fuel bills for March 2001 before the second unscheduled filing with the fuel bills for March 2001 including the first unscheduled filing.
