### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Staff") and respectfully states:

- 1. On October 18, 2001, Atmos Energy Corporation ("Atmos" or "Company") filed with the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") a tariff sheet with a proposed effective date of November 1, 2001. The tariff sheet reflects scheduled changes in Atmos' Purchased Gas Adjustment ("PGA") factors as a result of changes in the cost of natural gas for the 2001-2002 winter season, along with changes in the Actual Cost Adjustment, Transition Cost and Refund factors.
- 2. In the attached Memorandum, which is labeled Appendix A, the Staff recommends that the Commission approve the Company's proposed tariff sheet on an interimsubject-to-refund basis, and, based on good cause shown, on less than thirty days' notice.

WHEREFORE, the Staff respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order in accordance with the recommendations in the Staff's Memorandum attached hereto.

SUBJECT: Staff Recommendation for Atmos Energy Scheduled Winter Season PGA

Filing Effective November 1, 2001.

DATE: October 25, 2001

On October 18, 2001, Atmos Energy Corporation (Atmos or Company) of Franklin, Tennessee, filed a tariff sheet proposed to become effective November 1, 2001. On October 22, 2001, Atmos filed a substitute tariff sheet to reflect a recalculation of its Actual Cost Adjustment (ACA) factors and its Purchased Gas Adustment (PGA) factors for all three Districts. The tariff sheets were filed to reflect scheduled changes in Atmos's PGA factors as the result of changes in the estimated cost of natural gas for the upcoming winter season. Additionally, this tariff filing reflects changes in the Actual Cost Adjustment (ACA), Transition Cost (TC), and Refund Factors.

For Atmos's Butler District, the effect of these changes will decrease the firm PGA factor for the 2001-2002 winter season to \$0.25183 per Ccf from an unscheduled summer season firm PGA factor of \$0.67077 per Ccf. The effect of the proposed rate on a typical residential heating customer for the winter season is a decrease of approximately \$372 or 47% when compared to the rates currently in effect.

For Atmos's Kirksville District, the effect of these changes will decrease the firm PGA factor for the 2001-2002 winter season to \$0.33272 per Ccf from an unscheduled summer season firm PGA factor of \$0.78998 per Ccf. The effect of the proposed rate on a typical residential heating customer for the winter season is a decrease of approximately \$406 or 51% when compared to the rates currently in effect.

For Atmos's Southeast Missouri (SEMO) District, the effect of these changes will decrease the firm PGA factor for the 2001-2002 winter season to \$0.43643 per Ccf from an unscheduled summer season firm PGA factor of \$0.79986 per Ccf. The effect of the proposed rate on a typical residential heating customer for

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the winter season is a decrease of approximately \$323 or 38% when compared to the rates currently in effect.

Case No. GR-2001-396, under which these changes were filed, was established to track the Company's PGA factors to be reviewed in its 2000-2001 ACA filing. Atmos purchased the Missouri properties of Associated Natural Gas Company (ANG) in Case No. GM-2000-312 effective June 1, 2000. Atmos assumed all responsibilities for the former ANG Missouri properties pursuant to the Commission ORDER APPROVING STIPULATION AND AGREEMENT issued in Case No. GM-Case No. GR-2000-573 was established to address the PGA factors that will be reviewed in the 1999-2000 ACA filing. Case No. GR-99-392 was established to address the PGA factors that will be reviewed in the 1998-1999 ACA filing. Case No. GR-98-399 was established to address the PGA factors that will be reviewed in the 1997-1998 ACA filing. Interim subject to refund status should be maintained pending final Commission decisions in Case Nos. GR-98-399, GR-99-392, GR-2000-573 and GR-2001-396.

Due to the short time available to review the documentation supporting the ACA factor represented in this filing, the Procurement Analysis Department (PAD) has requested permission to submit its results and recommendations regarding the information included in this ACA filing to the Commission on or before June 1, 2002.

The Commission's Energy Department - Tariffs/Rate Design Staff (Staff) has reviewed this filing and has determined that it was calculated in conformance with Atmos's PGA Clause. Staff is of the opinion that good cause for approval of this tariff sheet on less than thirty days notice is demonstrated by Atmos's Commission-approved PGA clause allowing for ten (10) business days notice for PGA change filings. Therefore, Staff recommends that the following tariff sheet to become effective November 1, 2001, be approved, interim subject to refund:
