Ref: Direct Testimony of Charles D. Naslund, page 9 (Callaway Relicensing) According to Mr. Naslund's testimony, ¿AmerenUE will not be deciding whether or not to commence the relicensing process until around 2014.¿ Please respond to the following:

- a. State whether Mr. Naslund is aware of the October 2006 filing made by the Wolf Creek Operating Company with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (¿NRC¿) seeking to extend the original license for that nuclear generating station by 20 years.
- b. Explain whether Callaway is believed by Mr. Naslund to be more similar in design and construction to Wolf Creek than to any other operating nuclear generating station in the United States.
- c. Does Mr. Naslund or AmerenUE know of any reason why Callaway would be less able to satisfy NRC requirements for relicensing than Wolf Creek?
- d. If your response to part (c) is affirmative, please state and explain each known reason and provide copies of supporting reports, calculations, projections, workpapers and other documents associated with your response.
- e. Does Mr. Naslund or AmerenUE know of any financial or operational considerations at Callaway that would make NRC license extension for Callaway less advantageous than the pending NRC license extension being sought by the owners of Wolf Creek?
- f. If your response to part (e) is affirmative, please state and explain each known reason and provide copies of supporting reports, calculations, projections, workpapers and other documents associated with your response.

Response:

- a) Yes, I am aware of the Wolf Creek filing.
- b) Yes, Callaway is the same design as Wolf Creek for that portion of the plant referred to as the power block. Systems outside the power block specifically referred to as tertiary systems are of a different design.
- c) Since we have not started the relicensing process and we have not been involved with the Wolf Creek relicensing process, we are not aware of any reasons more or less on why Callaway could or could not meet the NRC licensing requirements.
- d) We are not aware of any at this time since the licensing process has not started.
- e) No, since no studies on these topics have been performed to date.
- f) We are not aware of any at this time since the licensing process has not started.
