

*To terminate a case in a Missouri administrative tribunal, you generally must file a written motion to dismiss or a voluntary withdrawal, depending on your position (petitioner or respondent). Termination usually requires the Administrative Law Judge's (ALJ) approval, often demonstrating that the issue is moot, settled, or that the agency lacks jurisdiction.*

**Motion to voluntary withdrawal of my Case Claim as the petitioner for CASE EC-2025-0150** The case matter had been simultaneously sought through other Administrative measures with Legislators as well as mediation from alternate Administrative assistance. The Case seemed to hold to several aspects that the ALJ Judge lacked jurisdiction including implied ADA health aspects of current regulatory lacking in Health & Safety proponents implementation. Many health aspects in current Regulatory that are pertinent to ALJ Judges jurisdiction currently for all extensive purposes these Regulatory deficiencies propose jurisdiction obstacles that were intrusive to a proper ruling to be derived from said Regulatory.

As the Petitioner I had involved and sought an exterior means of remedy and appreciate the Tribunal attempting to service this Case Matter within the limitations of the Tribunal.

I Petitioner Elizabeth Peterson on behalf of Case EC-2026-0150 request that ALJ JUDGE permit my case to be voluntarily withdrawn under these mitigating circumstances per Tribunal authority of jurisdictional based on current Regulatory that raised constraints that would have impaired the Judges ability to make a proper ruling upon the Full Scope of this Case Matter.

Effective today 3/26/2026 I rescind this Case upon ALJ Judge Clark's pending approval of voluntary withdrawal as other remedy was required sought and able to resolve to my satisfaction within the State of MO's Administrative recourse I was able to provide alternate permanent declaratory relief.

I thank the Tribunal for their efforts and the attempt to resolve this matter the court went above and beyond as did the Judge. I take nothing for granite and was sincerely in need of this Tribunal measure of due process which was an essential stability to keeping a temporary declaratory relief of restraint with the Respondent.

There was no guarantee to the final recourse wrought externally, yet it was solidified yesterday and so the Tribunal services are no longer needed in this matter, and again your Honor ALJ Judge Clark, as the petitioner I was treated fairly and justly by your extrodinary measures that went above and beyond the standard measures of a Tribunal Judge. Without your willingness and my external measures both in place keeping this could have resulted in health consequences that were very serious and life threatening. The pursuit of Justice was served and I thank you and your Staff for doing everything to assist myself as the petitioner.
