2025 Annual Community Solar Pilot Program Report

Missouri Public Service Commission (PSC) report

File Nos. EA-2016-0207 & ET-2020-0022

Report Summary

- Both Community Solar pilot energy centers, Lambert and Montgomery County, are in-service providing renewable energy to subscribers.
- The Pilot program resources are 100% subscribed by 1,823 customers and 1,021 customers on the Rider CSP waitlist.
- Subscribers are billed monthly for this service.
- The Renewable Energy Certifications (RECs) from the 2025 year of operation at the Lambert and the Montgomery County Community Solar facilities were retired on behalf of subscribers on March 30, 2026, in the North American Renewables Registry (NARR).
- A participant and non-participant survey was conducted in the spring of 2026, and the survey results are attached.

Background

In 2018, Ameren Missouri received PSC approval for a Community Solar pilot program.

An overall goal of this program is to provide access to solar generation to Ameren Missouri residential and small business customers who are interested in solar generation but may not have the ability or desire to install and maintain their own solar panels.

Program participants enroll and agree to pay for solar blocks of 100 kilowatt-hours (kWh) each that will replace an equivalent kWh amount of electricity they receive from their standard class of service. Customers can replace up to fifty percent of their average annual electric energy usage.

Resource Enrollment Status

As of May 18, 2026, the pilot program resources are 100% subscribed, with 280 customers on the Lambert energy center, 1,543 for the Montgomery energy center and 1,021 on the Rider CSP waitlist for a total of 2,844 customers. Zero customers are on the pilot waitlist.

Lambert Community Solar Facility

The first Community Solar facility is located on St. Louis Lambert International Airport property, which is an ideal location for solar panels with an abundance of open land that would otherwise go unused. Panel layout is designed to be positioned away from runways and out of the line-of-sight of pilots taking off or coming in for a landing.

The construction of this site started in February 2019, and the site was placed in-service on August 9, 2019. Participating customers received their first energy statement that reflected the new energy charges in August 2019 and have continued to be billed monthly.

Montgomery Community Solar Facility

The Montgomery County Solar Facility site was placed in-service on March 22, 2022. Participating customers received their first energy statement that reflected the new energy charges in March 2022 and have continued to be billed monthly.

Community Solar Pilot Program Survey Overview Summary

Ameren Missouri conducted two customer surveys according to the Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement submitted in File No. EA-2016-0207 on September 23, 2016, to better understand perceptions of the Community Solar Pilot Program: one of current participants and another of non-participating customers. Together, these surveys provide insight into customer satisfaction, awareness, and barriers to enrollment, and help identify opportunities to strengthen program performance and increase participation. The survey questions and results are attached to this report.

Participant Survey Summary Results

Ameren Missouri conducted a survey of customers enrolled in the Community Solar Pilot Program to assess satisfaction and perceptions. The survey was administered March 4–18, 2026 to 2,138 participants via email, with 267 respondents (12% response rate).

Overall satisfaction with the program is strong, with 73% of respondents reporting satisfaction and 71% indicating the program provides a meaningful solar option. Customers most commonly cited environmental benefits, access to solar without on-site installation, and support in managing future energy costs as key drivers of participation.

Most program features were viewed positively, with respondents indicating that terms are generally appropriate. While the enrollment process itself performs well, opportunities for improvement were identified in areas such as communication, customer education, and clarity around program costs and structure.

Support for program expansion remains strong. Respondents expressed clear interest in the development of additional solar facilities, with most indicating no preference regarding the location of new solar sites.

While overall perceptions of the Community Solar Pilot Program are favorable, enhanced communication and education efforts may further improve customer understanding, satisfaction, and confidence.

Non-Participant Survey Summary Results

Ameren Missouri also surveyed customers not enrolled in the Community Solar Pilot Program to assess awareness, perceptions, and barriers to participation. The survey was administered March 9–30, 2026, with 9,832 completed responses from customers invited via email.

Awareness of the Community Solar program is limited, with 82% reporting they had not seen or heard of it. Among those aware, cost-related concerns are the primary barrier to enrollment: 21% say they cannot afford the program, and 32% are concerned about added expenses.

After learning about the program, 16% reported being very or definitely interested, indicating that participation is limited by low awareness rather than lack of demand.

Overall, improving program awareness, clearly demonstrating bill impact, and strengthening transparency represent the greatest opportunities to increase participation.
