## STAFF'S MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION

**COMES NOW** the Staff ("Staff") of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission"), and requests clarification of the Commission's Report and Order as follows:

- 1. In its *Report and Order* issued January 9, 2013, at page 33, the Commission states that it "[i]s increasing KCPL's first blocks of the residential space heating rates and winter All-Electric General Services rates, and GMO's non-residential and residential rates, as Staff proposes." [Emphasis added].
- 2. On pages 39-40 of its *Report and Order*, the Commission states Conclusions of Law under the heading "Increase Space Heating and All-Electric Rates." There the Commission discusses Staff's recommendations for the KCPL RESB and RESC rate schedules, but does not mention Staff's similar recommendations for KCPL's Small General Service (SGS), Medium General Service (MGS), and Large General Service (LGS)<sup>1</sup> rate schedules.

- 3. Following that discussion of KCPL's RESB and RESC rate schedules the Commission states, "As to all Staff's proposed increases, the Commission concludes that safe and adequate service at just and reasonable rates finds the most support in the shifts that Staff proposes for KCPL. Therefore, the Commission will order those increase as Staff recommends."
- 4. As discussed in the Staff's Response to MECG's Motion for Clarification, because the Commission did not adopt all the positions set out in the Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement Regarding Class Cost of Service / Rate Design ("Stipulation"), Staff is not bound to the positions it took in that Stipulation.
- 5. In that *Stipulation*, Staff agreed, *inter alia*, to abandon its recommendation to increase the first block of the KCPL winter all electric LGS rate schedule.
- 6. However, since the Commission varied from the terms of the *Stipulation*—inconsistent with the Stipulation it did not "increase residential true-up revenues by 1.00% in addition to any other increase implemented by the commission," by the terms of the *Stipulation*, Staff reverted to its initial position of recommending increases to the first block of the KCPL winter all electric LGS rate schedule.
- 7. Staff seeks clarification that the Commission intended to order, and did order (1) Staff's recommended increases to the first block of the KCPL winter all electric SGS and MGS rate schedules, and (2) Staff's recommended increase to the first block of the KCPL winter all electric LGS schedule.

WHEREFORE, Staff respectfully requests the Commission clarify its Report and Order as to whether the Commission intended to order, and did order (1) Staff's recommended increases to the first block of the KCPL winter all electric SGS and MGS rate schedules, and (2) Staff's recommended increase to the first block of the KCPL winter all electric LGS schedule.
