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<u>accsigning</u> that had been issued in the U.S. during September. In these proceedings, the state commissions approver rate changes aggregating to a net increase of about \$223 million. RRA notes that three of these decisions did not establish newly authorized returns on equity (ROEs). In the four cases in which new equity returns were authorized, the state commissions adopted ROEs that ranged from 9.5% to 10.05%. By comparison, in previous issues of this monthly report, RRA had noted that there was just one rate case decided in <u>August</u> (gas) and six (four electric and two gas) rate cases decided in <u>July</u>.



In addition, there were three (two electric and one gas) <u>new rate cases</u> filed during September, including a Notice of Intent that did not Indicate the rate increase nor the ROE to be requested. In the other two rate cases filed during September, the companies seek rate increases aggregating to about \$164 million, each premised upon a 10.5% ROE.

There was a moderate amount of non-rate-case regulatory activity during September. Specifically, there were developments related to merger-approval proceedings in <u>Arkansas</u> and <u>Louisiana</u>, and also before the <u>New Orleans City Council</u> and the <u>Federal Energy Hegulatory Commission</u>. In Arkansas and <u>Texas</u>, there were developments regarding one utility's proposal to cede functional control of its transmission operations to a regional transmission organization, and in <u>California</u>, there were updates in an investigation into one utility's ability to pay fines stemming from a pipeline explosion. Also, in <u>Florida</u>, the commission deterred consideration of the recovery of costs associated with one utility's nuclear uprate program, and in <u>Pennsvivania</u>, there were updates in an investigation into the state's competitive retail power market.

There was no new major energy-related legislation enacted during September. In Florida, a commissioner was reappointed to serve a new term.
