Dear Judge Dippell,

On behalf of Missouri-American Water Company (“MAWC” or “Company”), I am providing herewith to the Missouri Public Service Commission (“Commission”) for filing certain tariff sheets in electronic form consisting of revised water and sewer tariff sheets. The proposed tariff sheets are listed on Appendix A, bear a date of issue of July 1, 2026, and an effective date of July 31, 2026.

The purpose of this filing is to implement a general rate increase for water and sewer service provided by MAWC. The revised rates are designed to produce \$191.9 million in additional annual water and sewer revenues (excluding gross receipts and sales taxes) or a 31.2% increase over revenues authorized in MAWC’s last general rate case (WR-2024-0320) and subsequent WSIRA cases (WR-2025-0345 and WR-2026-0160).

The water rates have been designed to implement the Company’s proposal to move to consolidated tariff pricing. Provided herewith as Appendix B is a description of the impact MAWC’s proposal would have on residential customers in each district utilizing 3,000, 4,000, and, 5,000 gallons monthly usage levels.

- For all residential water customers, the proposed rates includes a volumetric rate of \$14.1580 per 1,000 gallons of water, in addition to the meter charge.
- Current water rates include WSIRA of \$0.7507 per 1,000 gallons for St. Louis County customers and \$0.8042 per 1,000 gallons for other water customers.
- Current sewer rates include WSIRA of 0.229% of the total bill for Arnold customers, and 3.694% of the total bill for other wastewater customers.
- For all Arnold sewer customers, the proposed fixed charge of \$54.00 includes all customer usage.

PFAS Litigation Universal Surcredit "PLUS"

AVAILABILITY – This bill credit is available to all residential ("domestic") and non-residential service classifications.

*

DESCRIPTION – Missouri-American Water Company ("Company") sought compensation from various manufacturers of chemicals of Aqueous Film Forming Foam. This litigation was consolidated for the limited purpose of pursuing settlements into multi-district litigation no. 2873 ("MDL"), which are overseen by the United States District Court for the District of South Carolina. The Company has entered into multiple settlements in the MDL and may enter into further agreements. These settlements may provide one or more payments. The proceeds will be net of any costs to be paid out of the settlement funds incurred to administer or achieve the settlement. The purpose of this tariff is to provide a bill credit to the Company's customers that credits the total amount of the proceeds the Company receives from these MDL settlements.

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The proceeds from the MDL shall be credited to customers as a one-time bill credit within a reasonable time after the Company receives payment of the funds. The Company shall provide notice to the Commission Staff and the Office of the Public Counsel of the amount of proceeds included and a workpaper showing the determination of the credit as outlined below. The Company may combine proceeds resulting from the MDL settlement.

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SURCREDIT CALCULATION – The PLUS credit shall be calculated as follows:

MDLP represents the proceeds received from one or more MDL settlements.

AVAILABILITY – All residential (“domestic”), commercial, other public authority and sale for resale metered water customers.

SECTION A - DEFINITIONS

Actual Revenue (AR) shall mean the actual dollar amount of revenues billed to customers for the identified Service Classifications, excluding revenues arising from adjustments under this tariff and any other tariff, which were billed for the applicable Fiscal Year, excluding revenues from acquisitions approved by the Commission that have not yet been approved in a general rate case and any revenues collected under Rate I (Sheet RT 10) or Rate W (Sheets RT 11.1 and RT 11.2).

Actual Production Costs (APC) shall mean the actual dollar amount of power, chemicals, purchased water and waste disposal incurred by the Company in the Fiscal Year, excluding production costs from acquisitions approved by the Commission that have not yet been approved in a general rate case.

Effective Period shall mean the period for which the adjustments in Section B are to be billed to customers, and shall be the nine-month period April through December after the Filing Month.

Effective Period Usage (G) shall mean the number of 100 gallon units delivered to customers by the Company, including the number of 100 gallon units for the applicable Effective Period.

Filing Month shall mean the month in which an adjustment is determined by the Company and submitted to the Commission, on or before January 31.

Fiscal Year shall mean the Fiscal Year of the Company that ended as of the most recent December 31.

Interest (i) shall mean the Company short-term interest borrowing rate.

Previous Amortization Period shall mean the nine-month reconciliation amortization period that ended as of the most recent Fiscal Year.

Rate Case Revenue (RCR) shall mean the dollar amount of revenues reflected in the revenue requirements approved by the Commission for the applicable Service Classifications in the Company’s most recent general rate case. In a month or year in which new rates come into effect, the RCR shall be prorated based upon the number of days in the month or year under the old rates and the number of days in the month or year under the new rates.

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Revenue Stabilization Mechanism (RSM)

Rate Case Production Costs (RPC) shall mean the dollar amount of power, chemicals, purchased water and waste disposal expenses reflected in revenue requirements approved by the Commission in the Company’s most recent general rate case. In a month or year in which new rates come into effect, the RPC shall be prorated based upon the number of days in the month or year under the old rates and the number of days in the month or year under the new rates.

Upcoming Amortization Period shall mean the nine-month reconciliation amortization period commencing on April 1 following the Fiscal Year.

SECTION B – DETERMINATION OF ADJUSTMENT

SECTION C – REPORTS AND RECONCILIATIONS

The Company shall file with the Commission on or before January 30 of each year, the RSM calculation and support for any annual adjustments to be effective under this tariff. The Commission Staff will have 60 days to review. The reconciliation amount will be surcharged from April 1 through December 31 of each calendar year. Any credit will be issued as soon as administratively possible.

Rule 10 – Discontinuance of Water Service

- A. The Company may discontinue water service to a Customer for one or more of the following reasons:
1. Nonpayment of an undisputed delinquent charge.
 2. Failure to post a required deposit or guarantee.
 3. Unauthorized interference, diversion or use of the Company service situated or delivered on or about the Customer’s premises or supplied to a location other than the Customer’s premises.
 4. Failure to comply with terms of a settlement agreement, or payment extension agreement, including payment arrangements.
 5. Refusal after reasonable notice to permit inspection, maintenance, replacement or meter reading of Company equipment. If the Company has a reasonable belief that health or safety is at risk, notice at the time inspection is attempted is reasonable.
 6. Misrepresentation of identity in obtaining utility service.
 7. Violation of any other rules of the Company approved by the Commission which adversely affect the safety of the Customer or other persons or the integrity of the Company’s system.
 8. Non-payment of a sewer bill issued by the Company or pursuant to a contract between the Company and a sewer corporation, municipality or sewer district and as authorized by state statute. When water service is discontinued for this reason, any service charges for turn on/off or disconnection/reconnection within these rules shall not apply, and notice to the Customer shall be provided by rules and procedures applicable to the Customer's sewer service in lieu of notification required by these rules.
 9. Failure to install, test, or maintain a backflow preventor. *
 10. As provided by local, state or federal law. +
- B. None of the following shall constitute sufficient cause for the Company to discontinue service:
1. The failure of a Customer to pay for merchandise, appliances or services not subject to Commission jurisdiction as an integral part of the Company service provided by the Company, except for a sewer bill pursuant to 10A.8.
 2. The failure of the Customer to pay for service received at a separate metering point, residence or location. In the event of discontinuance or termination of service at a separate residential metering point, residence or location in accordance with these rules, the Company may transfer and bill any

- unpaid balance to any other service account of the Customer and may discontinue service after twenty-one (21) days after rendition of the combined bill, for nonpayment, in accordance with this rule.
- 3. The failure to pay the bill of another Customer, unless the Customer whose service is sought to be discontinued received substantial benefit and use of the service.
- 4. The failure of a previous owner or occupant of the premises to pay an unpaid or delinquent bill except where the previous occupant remains an occupant or user.
- 5. The failure to pay a bill correcting a previous under billing, whenever the Customer claims an inability to pay the corrected amount unless a utility has offered the Customer a payment arrangement equal to the period of under billing.
- C. Except for Provision A.8., above, notwithstanding any other provision of this Rule, the Company may postpone the discontinuance of water service to a residential Customer for a time of at least twenty-one (21) days if the Company is advised the discontinuance will aggravate an existent medical emergency of the Customer, a member of their family or other permanent resident of the premises where service is rendered. The Company may require a Customer to provide satisfactory evidence that a medical emergency exists.
- D. The Company will provide reasonable notice of any discontinuance of service to a Customer as practicable. However, notwithstanding any other provision of this rule, the Company may discontinue service temporarily to a Customer without advance notice for reasons of health, safety, property damage or other emergencies.
- E. If a Customer disputes a particular bill, the Company will not discontinue service for non-payment so long as the Customer:
 - 1. Pays the undisputed portion of the bill (if the parties are unable to determine the undisputed portion, the Customer shall pay to the utility fifty percent (50%) of the bill in dispute);
 - 2. Pays all future periodic bills by the due date; and
 - 3. Enters into discussions with the Company to settle the dispute in accordance with rules of the Missouri Public Service Commission. If agreement cannot be reached on settlement of the dispute, the Customer may register their dispute with the Missouri Public Service Commission in accordance with Commission rules.
- F. Except for Provision A.8., above, the Company shall not discontinue residential service pursuant to Provision A., above, unless written notice by first class mail is sent to the Customer at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the proposed discontinuance. Service of notice by mail is complete upon mailing. As an alternative, the Company may deliver a written notice in hand to the Customer at least ninety-six (96) hours prior to discontinuance. A notice of discontinuance of service shall not be issued as to that portion of a bill which is determined to be an amount in dispute pursuant to the Commission's Rules that is currently the subject of a dispute pending with the utility or complaint before the Commission, nor shall

Rule 19 – Access to Customer’s Premises (Customer Readings and Estimated Bills)

- A. Authorized personnel of the Company shall have access at all reasonable hours to the premises supplied for the purpose of making necessary examination of the plumbing and fixtures, taking meter readings, changing meters, installing, removing or servicing remote reading attachments, testing, repairing, or replacing backflow preventers, and for any other reasons deemed necessary by the Company. Such access must be provided as specified in this rule to avoid discontinuance of service.
- B. CUSTOMER READINGS: Customers may read the meter and submit readings. These readings must be submitted to the Company within the time allotted to be used as a basis for billing. In addition, Customers must permit Company personnel access to obtain an actual meter reading by electing one of the options set out in Provision D.1., 2., 3. or 4., below, to confirm the Customer meter readings at least once annually for monthly billed Customers.
- C. ESTIMATED BILLS: If the Company is unable to obtain an actual meter reading and a Customer read is not submitted to the Company within the time allotted, the Company will estimate the bill in accordance with Rule 9J. and K., and Rule 18, above. If no usable (timely received) Customer meter readings are provided to the Company, the Customer must permit Company personnel to obtain a meter reading as set out in Provision D.1., 2., 3. or 4., below, at least once every year for monthly billed Customers.
- D. The Company may discontinue service as provided in this rule if a Customer fails to cooperate with the Company to obtain an actual meter reading by not:
 - 1. Providing access to the meter at the regularly scheduled reading time, as provided to the Customer;
 - 2. Requesting an appointment reading during regular business hours, subject to a service charge as specified on the applicable schedule of service charges;
 - 3. Contracting for and permitting the installation of a remote meter reading attachment; or
 - 4. Providing a meter box at or near the property line together with approved connections and piping for installation of a meter.

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
