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CRITICAL MEDICAL NEEDS PROGRAM

Q. What is the CMNP?

A. The CMNP is designed to promote and finance a community-based information resource network and program staff that will identify and direct customers with critical medical needs to resources that will:

- Help customers with maintaining or restoring utility services,
- Avoid negative impacts on residents with serious medical conditions,
- Address utility arrears, and
- Provide a streamlined process to complementary services.

Additionally, the program provides outreach and training to community stakeholders that will allow them to identify individuals that are critical medical needs for assistance and refer such individuals to available assistance resources.

Q. What is Evergy Missouri Metro, Inc., d/b/a Evergy Missouri Metro's (EMM") proposal on the CMNP?

A. Evergy Missouri Metro stated in response to Data Request 302 that they have not proposed any changes to any of the current Low-Income Programs or its customer eligibility requirements and has recommended to continue the programs currently in effect as part of this case.

Q. What is the current budget for the CMNP for Evergy Missouri Metro?

A. The current budget is \$300,000 with a 50/50 sharing between shareholders and ratepayers.

Q. What is OPC's proposal on the CRMP?

1 A. Dr. Marke proposes to increase funding level to \$2 million (with a 50/50
2 sharing) for the CMNP and he recommends the tariff should be drafted to allow funding
3 to be fungible with other programs if spending stalls.

4 Q. What is Staff's response to Dr. Marke's recommendation?

5 A. EMM provided information on their Low-Income Programs in the
6 Low-Income Workshop Case No. OW-2026-0085. This information explained that the
7 EMM only spent roughly \$71,000 of its total \$300,000 CRMP budget in 2024. Therefore, it
8 is Staff's opinion there is no need to increase the funding level to \$2 million. Additionally,
9 Staff with would like to see the outcome of the Low-Income Workshop before proceeding
10 with any major changes to the current Low-Income programs, including allowing funding
11 to be moved to other programs.

12 Q. Does this conclude your rebuttal testimony?

13 A. Yes.

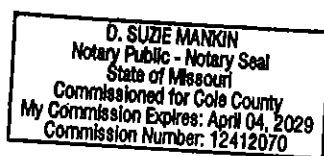

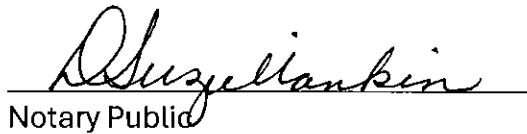
