Our external e-mail address for the Experimental Advanced Renewable Program ("EARP") is AR_Tariff_Inquiries@cmsenergy.com. I have added your information to the list of interested parties that will be contacted after the process for enrolling customers has been implemented.

In general, the EARP is a program that offers a firm price for energy produced by a Solar PV system for up to term of up to 12 years. For residential systems, the price is proposed at \$0.65/kWh if the system is available in 2009 and \$0.525/kWh if the system is available in 2010. For Commercial systems, the rate is proposed at \$0.450/kWh for systems available in 2009 and \$0.375 for systems available in 2010. To qualify for the EARP payments, the Solar PV system must be connected such that all of the energy is fed directly to the utility grid through a meter separate from the customers electric service. It must also be manufacured with Michigan materials or installed with Michigan Labor.

Please note that while EARP has been approved, we can not offer the EARP rates for Solar Energy until August 27th. Consumers is in the process of developing the specific technical guidelines and procedures for participants who will be involved in our program.
