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Today is July 31st, 2018, 1 JUDGE CLARK: 2 and the current time is 12:25 p.m. The Missouri Public Service Commission has 3 set aside this time for a local public hearing 4 5 in File Nos. ER-2018-0145 and ER-2018-0146, 6 which are respectively captioned as: In the 7 Matter of Kansas City Power & Light Company's 8 Request For Authority To Implement A General 9 Rate Increase For Electric Service, and, In the 10 Matter of KCP&L's Greater Missouri Operation Company's Request For Authority To Implement A 11 12 General Rate Increase For Electric Service. My name is John Clark, regulatory law 13 judge that's been assigned to preside over this 14 15 hearing. With me today is Commissioner Maida 16 Coleman. Commissioner Scott Rupp is on his 17 way. Rupp that he not continue his travels here, as 1 2 he's driving in from a meeting out of state and was rushing here to get to it, so I will be 3 representing the office today. 4 There are five commissioners. And even 5 when we don't have a full contingency of all 6 7 five of us, the information is always provided 8 to the four commissioners in order for them to 9 get all of the same information that I would 10 hear at this hearing. 11 The judge will explain that in just a 12 little bit more detail, but I would like to say thank you for coming out today and 13 participating. I look forward to the questions 14 15 or the comments that will be offered. 16 So thank you. Thank you, Judge. Thank you, Commissioner. 17 JUDGE CLARK: 18 I'm going to begin by asking counsel to enter 19 their appearances for the record, starting with 20 KCP&L Company. 21 MR. STEINER: Let the record reflect Roger 22 W. Steiner, appearing on behalf of the company. 23 My contact information has been given to the court reporter. 24 2.5 Thank you, Mr. Steiner. I'll place you under oath, 9 because I take testimony under oath, and then 10 I'll give you the opportunity to make your 11 comment. 12 This is an opportunity for you to tell the 13 Commission what you think. So at this time is there anybody who would like to make a comment 14 15 for the Commission? 16 (No response.) 17 THE COURT: I see no hands, so that's going to make the rest of this fairly short. 18 19 will say you showed up for a question and 20 answer session today. For those of you that 21 did, I hope you got your questions answered. 22 The Commission and I are not here to answer 23 your questions today, and that's because 24 commissioners have to remain impartial until 2.5 after the evidentiary hearing.

1	I can't think of anything else that I need
2	to say. If you get home today and you decide
3	that you do, in fact, want to make a comment,
4	but you didn't want to make it in the
5	surrounding, you are free to contact the Office
6	of the Public Counsel or to go to the Public
7	Service Commission's webpage, and there's a
8	spot for you to click on to leave a public
9	comment if you would like to do so.
10	If you get home and you decided that you
11	wish you would have made a comment, or if
12	you're talking to a friend or neighbor and they
13	realize that they would like to make a comment,
14	that's how you go about doing that.
15	With all that said, this hearing is now
16	adjourned. Thank you so much for showing up,
17	and we'll go off the record.
